## **General Features**

- The African Tulip Tree is a flowering tree native to tropical dry forests of Africa.
- It grows between 7-25 meters (23-82 feet) tall.
- Leaves are large, glossy, and pinnate, with
  4-7 pairs of leaflets.
- Flowers are the most striking feature, with large, showy, bell-shaped blooms in reddishorange or crimson (rarely yellow).

- Flowers bloom year-round in warm climates, but with peak flowering in the spring and summer.
- The fruit is a large, woody capsule that splits open to reveal numerous winged seeds.

## Uses

- Ornamental: Widely planted as an ornamental tree throughout the tropics due to its vibrant flowers.
- Timber: Wood is used for furniture, construction, and other applications, though not a primary use due to the tree's ornamental value.
- Medicine: In some regions, bark and flowers are used in traditional medicine.
