- Fruits: The fruit is round or heart shaped, with a scaly or knobby surface, resembling a pine cone. The flesh is creamy white, sweet, and aromatic, containing numerous black seeds.
- Growth: The tree prefers well drained, sandy, or loamy soils and thrives in tropical and subtropical climates. It requires regular watering but can tolerate short dry spells.
