Characteristics of Ziziphus mauritiana

Size: Ziziphus mauritiana typically grows up to 512 meters (1639 feet) tall, with a spreading canopy.

Leaves: The leaves are glossy green, ovate to elliptic in shape, and arranged alternately along the branches.

Flowers: The flowers are small, yellow to greenish yellow, and fragrant. They are borne in clusters in leaf axils.

Fruits: The fruit of Ziziphus mauritiana is a small, round berrylike drupe, 23 cm in diameter, with a smooth skin that turns from green to yellow, and finally reddish brown or brownish black when ripe. The pulp is sweet and aromatic, containing a single seed. Bark: The bark is greyish brown and rough textured.
