**Report**

Oddarpalayam is a village situated 16 km away from Hosur. People of this village are living in a very peaceful manner. Agriculture is the main profession of this village. A primary school is present in the village.

The students of I UG from the department of mathematics took initiative in conducting the extension activity in the village on the theme "child labour and stop smoking and drinking". The students went to the village during the academic year 2021-2022. As part of our extension activity, we embarked on a journey to raise awareness about the disadvantages of consuming smoking and alcohol and about child labour.

Our primary goal was to equip the residents of oddarpalayam to know about the bad impacts of smoking as smoking cigarettes affects the respiratory system, the circulatory system, the reproductive system, the skin, and the eyes, and it increases the risk of many cancers.

And also we also said about the disadvantages of consuming alcohol that is alcohol is potentially addictive, can cause intoxication, and contributes to health problems and preventable deaths. If you already drink at low levels and continue to drink, risks for these issues appear to be low. But the risk is not zero.

And also the villagers gain deeper understanding of child labour that is child labour and exploitation are the results of many factors, including poverty, social norms condoning them, lack of decent work opportunities for adults and adolescents, migration and emergencies. These factors are not only the cause but also a consequence of social inequities reinforced by discrimination.

Our extension activity in Oddarpalayam had given immense knowledge about the disadvantages of smoking, consuming alcohol and child labour. By empowering the villagers with knowledge so that they will be aware of the negative impact of child labour, smoking, alcohol.

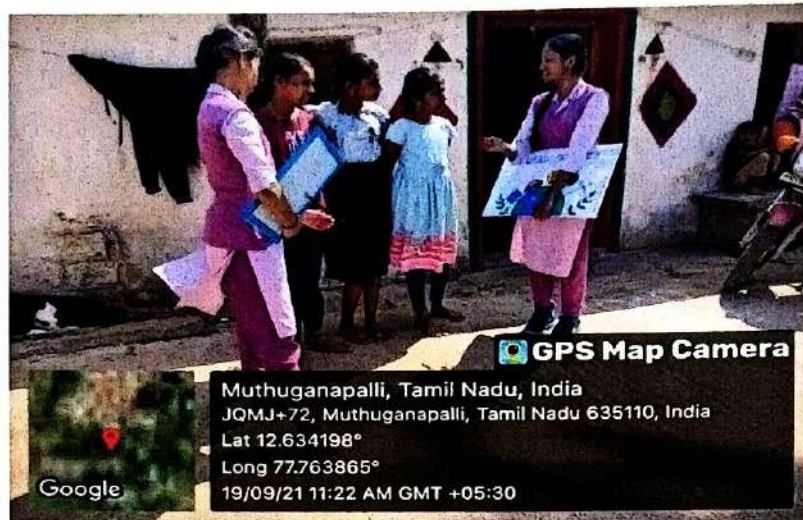

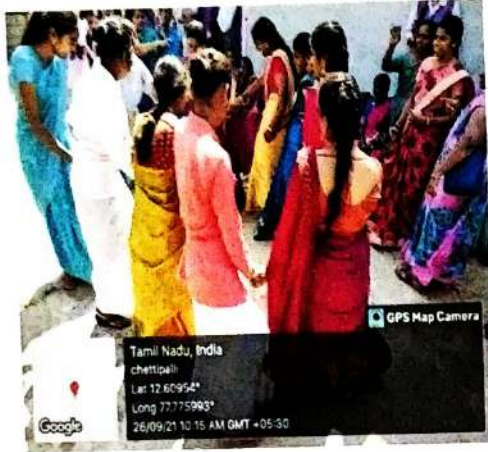

Vadrapallyam is a village situated 12 km away from Hosur. The Village was very small with a very little population. Agriculture is the main profession of this village. The students of III and I - B.Sc. Biotechnology, from the Department of Biotechnology took initiative in conducting the extension activity in the village on the theme "Awareness about the power of Medicinal Plants". The students went to the village twice during the academic year. As part of our extension activity, we took our goal to conserve and utilize the natural herbs which are easily available in the villages. Our aim is to promote the uses and benefits of medicinal herbs among the residents of Vadrapallyam. Our primary goal was to promote the use and conservation of medicinal plants. Medicinal plants have been used for thousands of years across various cultures and civilizations to prevent, treat, and manage a wide range of health conditions. The use of medicinal plants encompasses traditional medicine systems like Ayurveda, Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM), Indigenous healing practices, and modern herbal medicine. 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

## Report

The village of Perakkapalli is located 16 kilometers from Hosur. The villagers live in great harmony with one another. This village's primary occupation is agriculture. There's a primary school in the village. The students of I. B.Sc. Chemistry, from the department of Chemistry took initiative in conducting the extension activity in the village on the theme "Organic Farming and Awareness on plastic usage". The students went to the village twice during the academic year. The primary objective of the extension activity was to educate the residents of Perkkapalli about the detrimental effects of plastic pollution on the environment and to advocate for the adoption of organic farming methods as a sustainable alternative.

- Explained the advantages of various savings products.




2. Date: March 6, 2022:

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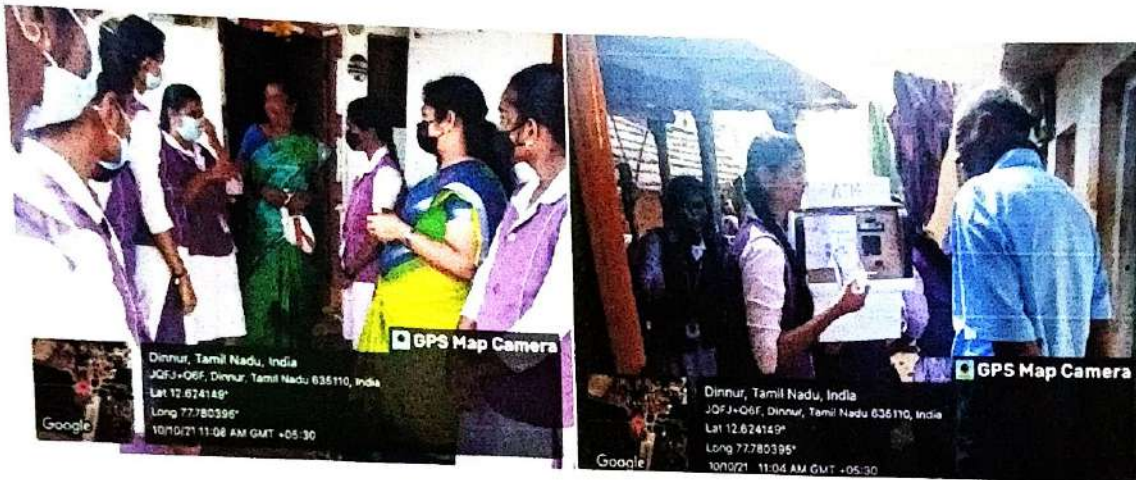

**Report**

Barandur is a small village secured by S.Muduganapally panchayat, Hosur. The peoples were all middle class families and giving Richest Respect as, they are all Farmers working with own garden facilities. The Students of I B.Com CA – A & B from Department of Commerce, St. Joseph's College of Arts and Science for women visited Barandhur for the purpose to educate the traditional banking knowledge and basic challan filling process to the people those who don't aware about banking activities.

This report aims to explore the current scenario of challan filling and traditional banking in Barandhur, highlighting the challenges faced by the village people and suggesting potential solutions for improvement.


Challan filling, a common practice for various purposes such as fee payments and utility bill payments plays a crucial role in the financial transactions of the village people in Barandhur. However, the process of challan filling is predominantly manual, requiring individuals to visit bank branches or designated centers to fill out physical forms and make payments in cash.

Traditional banking practices in Barandhur are primarily centered on the use of passbooks and cash transactions. Most villagers rely on passbooks to record their transactions, including deposits, withdrawals, and interest accruals. However, the lack of awareness about modern banking services, such as online banking and mobile banking, has limited the adoption of these services among the village people.

Group discussions were organized to encourage active participation and knowledge sharing among participants. Villagers had the opportunity to ask question, seek clarification on banking matters and they share their experiences related to traditional banking and challan filling.

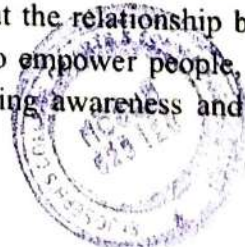

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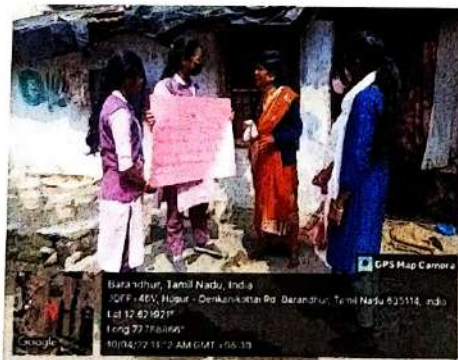

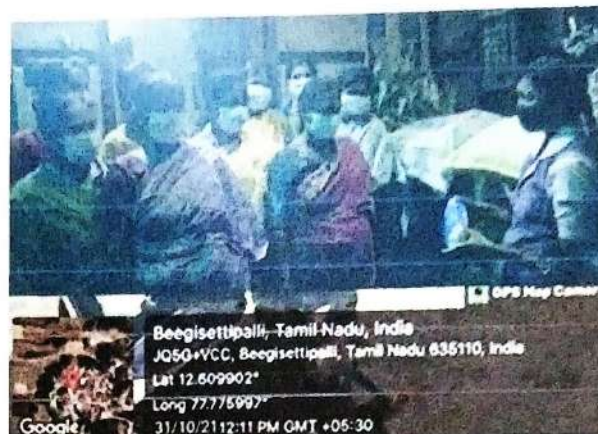
Our extension program in B. Chettipalli helped the villagers become more proficient readers and writers and taught them how to use napkins correctly.

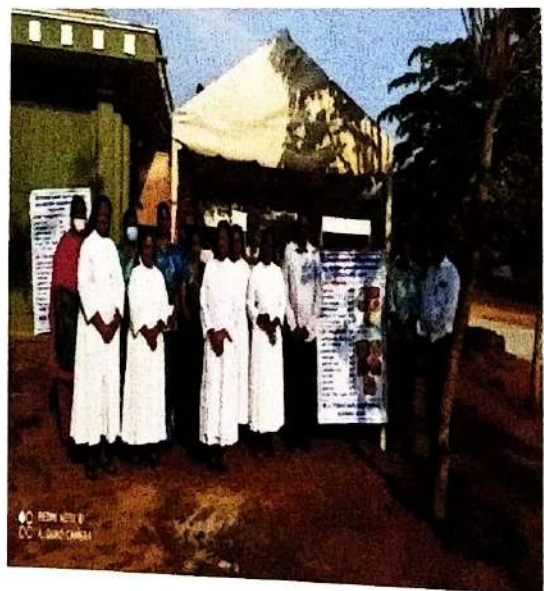
