## **NATIONAL CONSUMER DAY**



Additionally, the event aimed to raise awareness about the critical times when hand washing is



### **COCONUT DAY**




### **ORGANIC DAY**

### WORLD DIABETIC DAY














# WORLD ASTEROID DAY CELEBRATION


Different delights were offered to the faculties. Also the Students together had planned amazing surprises which brought stunning smiles on the face of every teacher.




