On 18th February 2018, Mr. K.Murugesh Reddy was the chief guest and gave a speech on NSS service and schemes for the students.

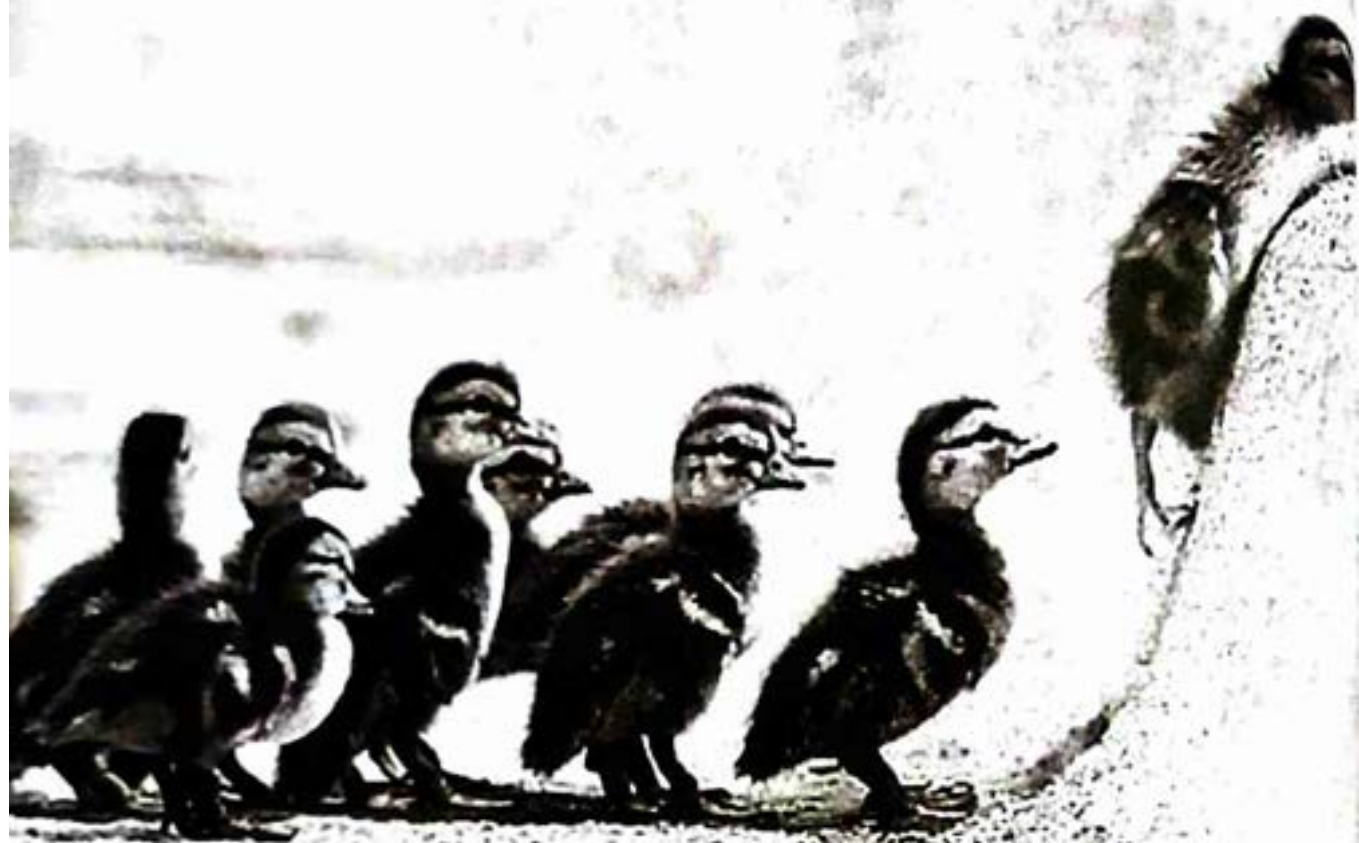

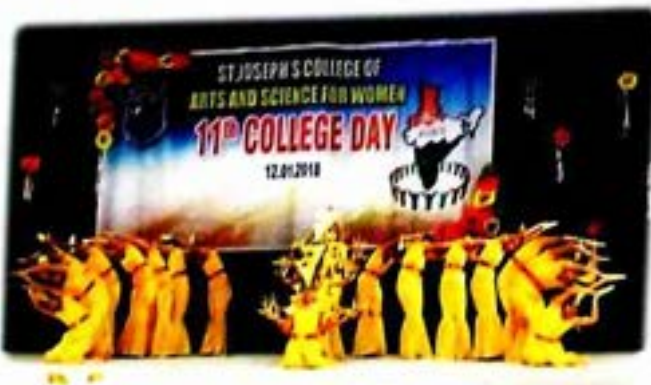
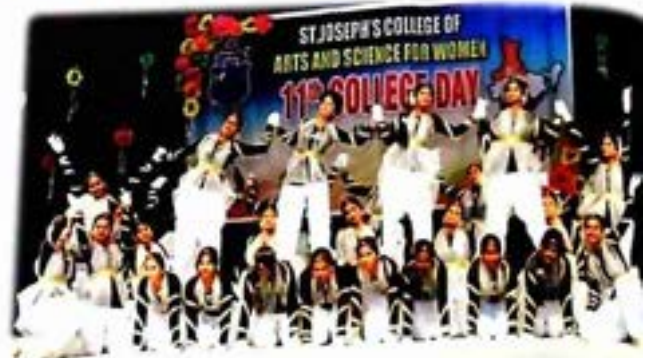

CHILD ABUSE IN SOCIETY

Child abuse happens when a parent or other adult causes serious physical or emotional harm to a child. Most of the time, kids know their abusers and the abuse happens at home. This makes it difficult for kids to speak up. They may feel trapped by the affection they feel for the abusers or fear of the power the abusers have over them so they stay silent. Child abuses can be of the following forms:

1. Physical abuse
2. Sexual abuse
3. Neglect and abandonment
4. Emotional or psychological abuse

The most serious cases of child abuse can end in death. Those who survive may suffer emotional scars that can last long after the physical bruises are healed. Kids who are abused are more likely to have problems building and maintaining relationships throughout their lives. They also have low self-esteem, depression, thoughts of suicide and other mental health issues.

Child abuse is more than bruises and broken bones. While physical abuse might be the most visible, other types of abuse such as emotional abuse and neglect, also leave deep lasting scars on kids. The earlier abused children get help, the greater chance they have to heal and break the cycle rather than perpetuate it. By learning about common signs of abuse, we can intervene and make a huge difference in child's life.

Child abuse isn't just about black eyes. Ignoring children's needs putting them in unsupervised, dangerous situations, exposing them to sexual situations, or making them to feel worthless are also forms of child abuse and neglect. Regardless of the type of abuse the result is a serious emotional harm.

All types of abuse and neglect leave lasting scars which might be physical but emotional scarring has long lasting effects throughout life. Many children worldwide suffer abuse every year, affecting all educational and socioeconomic levels, ethnicities, cultures and religions. The most common form of child abuse in our Country is being left at home alone without adult supervision, also called supervision neglect. All the forms of neglect account for about 75% of the child abuse reports made to child welfare authorities. Other common forms of child abuse include physical assault, physical neglect, emotional abuse and sexual assault that involves physical contact.

IMPOSSIBILITY TO SURVIVE WITHOUT AN ENVIRONMENT

"We won't have a society, if we destroy the environment"

- Margaret Mead

INTRODUCTION:

Social problems are the issues that directly or indirectly affect the majority or all the members of a society. Social problems affect the fabric of the community and they lie beyond the control of one individual no matter how much the power he or she holds.

The rapid development of the society leads to many social problems such as environment, poverty, illiteracy, unemployment, injustice, child abuse and child marriage etc.

Child abuse is a common problem worldwide. I felt that child marriage is also a kind of child abuse. The second major issue is Unemployment. Therefore, I would like to share my personal views on child marriage and unemployment in this Article.

SEXUAL ABUSE RECURRENT IN CHILD MARRIAGES:

A newly released study on child marriages points out that physical and sexual abuse, domestic violence and depression are common among the girls who were married off in their childhood. Child marriage limits young girl's skills, resources, knowledge, social support, mobility and autonomy. They are therefore extremely vulnerable to domestic violence, abuse and abandonment.

Child marriage is a violation of child rights and has a negative impact on physical growth, health, mental and emotional development, and education opportunities. It also affects society as a whole since child marriage reinforces a cycle of poverty and perpetuates gender discrimination, illiteracy and malnutrition as well as high infant and maternal mortality rates.

Both girls and boys are affected by child marriage, but girls are affected in much larger numbers and with greater intensity. Child marriage can be seen across the country but it is far higher in rural than in urban areas. In general, rates of child marriage are highest in the Central and Western parts of India and lower in the eastern and southern parts of the country.

GIRLS MARRIED AS CHILDREN ARE MORE LIKELY TO BE :

- ❖ Girls from poorer families, scheduled castes and tribes, and with lower education level.
- ❖ Drop outs of school have a low-paid jobs and limited decision- making power at home.
- ❖ Face violence, abuse and exposure to HIV/AIDS and other sexually transmitted diseases because they have fewer skills and less negotiating power.
- ❖ A girl with 10 years of education has a six times lower chance of being pushed into marriage before she is 18.

UNICEF IN ACTION:

- ❖ UNICEF is working alongside the Government of India in its efforts to prevent child marriage, including the implementation of the convergent national strategy, which includes:
- ❖ Law enforcement : Capacity -building on laws, support mechanisms such as a child marriage telephone hotline.
- ❖ Girls' empowerment : Life skills, protection skills.
- ❖ Community mobilization : Working with influential leaders, oaths and pledges, counselling, folk and traditional media.
- ❖ Promoting convergence of sectors at all levels, in particular with education and social protection schemes and programmes.

GOVERNMENT'S STRATEGY AND ACTION:

The Government of India is also implementing national programmes aimed at protecting and promoting the development of children, while states are supporting these initiatives through state-level schemes. However, many of the programmes focus on addressing financial vulnerability through cash transfer schemes to keep girls in school.

At the same time, there is a legal framework to prevent child marriage and protect children:

- ❖ The prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006 makes it illegal for girls to marry under 18 years and for boys under 21 years. Child marriage can be by the child but within two years of becoming an adult.
- ❖ Child marriage is a punishable offence with a fine up to INR 100,000, or upto two years of imprisonment, or both. It is a non-cognizable and non-bailable offence.
- ❖ Dowry as prohibited in 1961 by the Dowry Prohibition Act, with a fine up to INR 15,000, or the dowry amount, whichever is higher, and imprisonment for between six months and five years.
- ❖ Other laws that may provide protection to a child bride include the Juvenile Justice Act, 2000, the Domestic Violence Act, 2005 and the Protection of children from sexual offences Act, 2012.
- ❖ "Ending child marriage must be a priority in the global effort to end violence against women".

UNEMPLOYMENT IN INDIA :

One of the most disturbing problems in India has been the mounting rate of unemployment, both in rural and urban sectors. The rate of unemployment varies over a wide range among the different states of India.

As per information available on the official website of the "Centre of Monitoring Indian Economy (CMIE)", there are currently nearly 31 million unemployed Indians looking for jobs. It was noted that the week ended on February 25, the unemployment rate increased to 6.1% as compared 5% in January. This 6.1% unemployment rate is noted to be the highest monthly rate in the past 15 months.

This brings us to the conclusion that as a new batch of students is set to graduate in 2018, India will face a yet another jolt of unemployment. While there are about 31 million unemployed youth in India as of February, the number of job creation in 2018 is limited to an estimated 6, 00,000.

CONCLUSION:

Unless unemployment problem is solved, the future of India cannot be bright. There will be no peace and prosperity in the country if jobless people do not get proper channel. More attention should be given otherwise this problem can make jobless youths go to wrong direction.

While, we in India focus on marks and performance in examinations, the system in Finland has no examinations at all for the first few years, the first main exam being at the age of sixteen. Children are then able to learn without having to limit themselves to a syllabus, though of course standards are delineated.

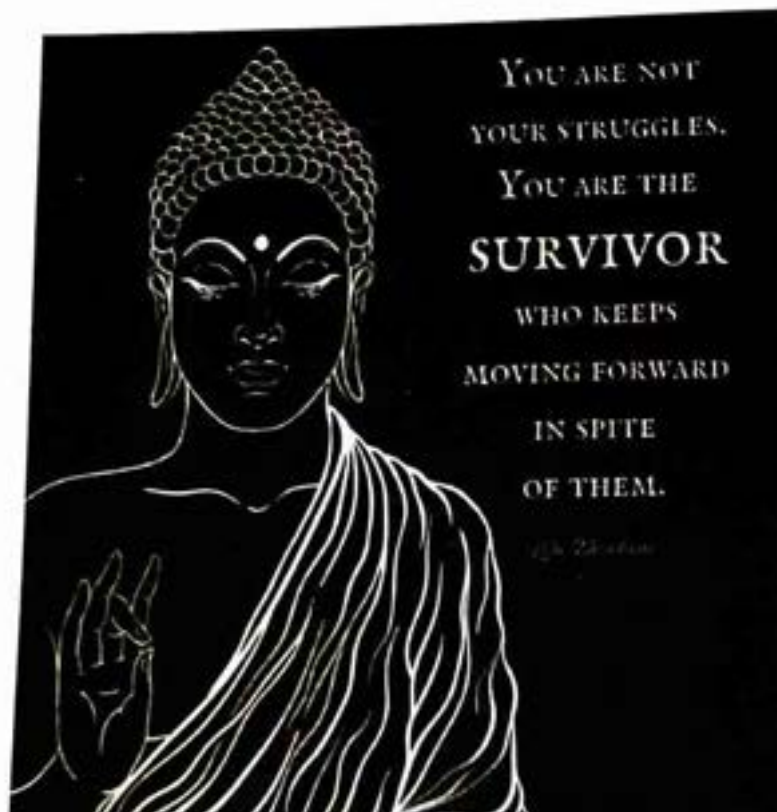
In India, we are trying a system with no examinations for the first eight years of schooling. But the differences are huge. Each class has a teacher and a teaching assistant, and there is extra support easily available for the weak students. Teachers are recruited and their starting incomes are less than that of their peer group. While teacher pay has improved in recent years to very respectable levels for government schools, many low income private schools still pay a pittance. Teacher training suffers from the usual problem of a few good schools and thousands of mediocre places for training teachers.

Teachers in India rarely get any support after they start working, and often the in-career training is not taken seriously. Teachers have to manage classes of forty students, on average, and they do it alone without assistance, with minimal planning and with no resource or specialist help for the students who are falling behind. For many teachers, this means that they are unable to focus on the bottom half of the class. For the students lagging behind, there is little respite from feeling a failure, and from feeling overburdened by greater expectations each year even as they realise they have not mastered the previous. And this is at the core of the flaws in building citizens for the future.

People must strive to make society more equal. Even traffic fines depend on income, with millionaires being charged tens of thousands of Euros for the same crime for which students pay a hundred Euros. Schools work the same way – the weakest are allowed to work their way up at their own pace. At the same time, teachers work hard to ensure that each and every child gets the care needed.

Can India ever build such care into its teaching? We have to – else much of our investment in teaching is wasted. We have the chance with the RTE to prove that we have the heart as well as the tools to deliver quality education to the child who needs it most. If 25% of children in each school are going to come from the weakest sections of society, then they are going to need the support – Finland style, outside class. This requires resources – and so far there has been little talk about how this will be delivered. The children left behind are not just from different economic classes but also from the downtrodden. Their academic confidence is fragile, but the competence is clearly waiting to be discovered. With health and nutrition support, there is evidence to prove that achievement levels can match those of more privileged children. Hence, students should be given their freedom of choice to learn better in various disciplines which would promote the growth of education system leading to employment and entrepreneurship with talents and abilities to create students future and gradually increase the economic and social development of the country.

THE FIVE BIGGEST PROBLEMS FACED BY TODAY'S SOCIETY

"We live in a society where spurious realities are manufactured by the media, by government, by big corporations, by religious groups and political groups. I ask in my writing, what is real? Because unceasingly we are bombarded with pseudo realities manufactured by very sophisticated people using very sophisticated electronic mechanisms."

We have to be bold in our nation's ambitions:

- Ø At First, we must win the fight against poverty within the next decade.
- Ø Secondly, we must improve moral standards in government and society to provide a strong foundation for good governance.
- Ø Thirdly, we must change the character of our politics to promote fertile ground for reforms.

Here are our five biggest problems,

Automation and the future economics:-

With our technology, I read a new estimate recently which claims that within 10 years 1/3 of our jobs can be replaced by automation. Now technological advancement and progress is by default a good thing, but in this instance, our current economic structure is not compatible. Our current economy is essentially based on work hours, so without those work hours our current system collapses. What happens when 1/3 of our population has no income at all? Now let's take away our current economic system and automation, which is exactly based on the purpose of technology. Outside of our economic system, a goal has been dreamed of, because of our current structure, which is one of the single largest threats to our society.

If, we maintain our current structure, 1/3 of the jobs becoming automated would cause poverty to skyrocket, the economic divides between the wealthy and poor, the poor will blame the wealthy. We need to come up with a new structure of our economy that makes work hours less necessary. I envision something along the lines of a universal income, getting rid of the doled out benefits for the poor and instead giving every citizens a yearly paycheck. While at the same time everyone will know that they will have the minimum needed to survive even if they end up being one of the ones who is unable to find work.

IDENTITY POLITICS:-

Identity politics is quickly becoming a very dangerous problems in our society. Don't get me wrong, discrimination and inequality in any form is wrong and unacceptable, but it is being used as a factor contributing to the extreme polarization of political parties. For example:- say a person were to make a speech addressing a very important issue. Say that person had brilliant ideas, the speech addresses them perfectly and the great leaps in progress can potentially be made inspired by that speech. Let's say during that speech the speaker inadvertently used an improper pronoun or said something that could be interpreted as slightly sexist. The right is so polarized, it will be automatically disagreed and the speaker will be bashed. The extreme left focused on identity politics will be so outraged by the simple mistake so busy calling the speaker 'transphobic/sexist/etc.' the purpose of the speech is long forgotten and nothing is done but more bickering , fighting and polarizing.

In the area of identity politics, the extreme left is becoming more and more authoritarian, which is exactly what they say the right is guilty of. The extremes, the loudest and most covered by the media of both the left and the right are authoritarian just on different ends.

RELIGION:-

"Science without religion is lame, religion without science is blind."

With today's technology and understandings of the universe we can say beyond a doubt that every single form of monotheistic religion is invalid. May be some of the more spiritualistic religions still have a little room, but every single religion is also propagating manipulation and division. Yes, people will argue that we cannot absolutely disprove the existence of a god, but we also can't disprove the existence of dozens of gods and they cannot prove their version of that religion is any more or less accurate than another. All the three major religions 'Judaism, Christianity and Islam' are based on the same original doctrine. All of these religions need to be looked at the same way ancient mythology looked at. Interestingly, good insight into the thinking and attitudes of past culture, we know that the thunder isn't caused by the guy with a hammer running around the sky. Instead out of fear of their beliefs, few go so far as to believe science itself is a lie. As, long as these religion are allowed to survive despite its bad influence, society will suffer.

EDUCATION:-

"Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world."

It is no surprise that among the higher educated there are fewer conservatives and fewer religious people. Since the higher educated people are most exposed to multiple cultures that extremes of identity politics are able to take hold. A lack of education is partially responsible for the polarization, clinging to religion, also contributing to the decisions and actions that violate civil and human rights which result in that outrage.

Our educational system is falling drastically behind the rest of the world. Children are taught what to think rather than how to think. It's more important to obey the rules and structure than it is to intellectually thrive. Our school system is designed to bring the lowest up slightly and the highest down to the average. The extreme right is already working on dismantling what we have left of an educational system, diverting funding to religious schools, and causing a further decline in education which results in more votes for them. Basically they want people to remain uneducated and clinging to fantasies because that is where their votes come from. For our society to thrive we have to address the problems of our early education system and we have to make higher education more affordable and available to everyone. Otherwise everyone's problems will be intense and the result will be unpleasant especially, with the automation looming before us.

POLITICAL POLARIZING :-

"Hatred, anger and violence can destroy us: the politics of polarization is dangerous."

Political polarization is likely the single biggest threat our society faces. It's more of a threat than automation simply because until this polarization is addressed it will be impossible to address the rest. Decisions in congress are no longer made out of collaboration they are made along party lines and forced by votes. Our system wasn't meant to be ruled by parties to begin with much less a system dominated by few big factors of this polarization they are, money, religion and power. The money in politics maintains the power of the party more important than representing the people who are supposed to be working for.

The parties work to maintain themselves, the politicians aligned with those parties work to maintain the party in exchange for the sweet power and wealth. Meanwhile the people are at each other's throats, the strategy to maintain their power has worked to well and created beasts they can't control. The right wing beasts has already taken them over and soon enough we'll find a left wing beasts that will take over the left. Think of a modern civil war, no boundaries or no borders just neighbours Vs neighbours on a national scale. The only way to avoid it is to get off the damned lines, stop focusing on extremes, keep the government secular like it was designed to be and start collaborating instead of bickering.

According to the National Center for Children in Poverty (NCCP) that poverty is the single greatest threat to children's well being. Mommy cannot afford a tutor or Daddy cannot afford a counselor.

10. **EROSION OF NATIONAL PRIDE / IDENTITY**

Unfortunately most folks tend to focus on their selves and not the whole. We see these problems as affecting "them" & not "me/us". Hence, we should sustain our identity as the citizens of the nation.

ATAL BHUJAL YOJANA

In order to manage water resources efficiently and strengthen groundwater recharge, the government has decided to fast track Atal bhujal yojana conceived at a cost of Rs. 6000 Crores. The Central Ground Water Board statistics levels 1034 out of 6584 assessed blocks to be over exploited where the amount of groundwater extracted is far more than recharge. The program is expected to be approved before March 31st, so that it could be implemented from April 1, 2018.

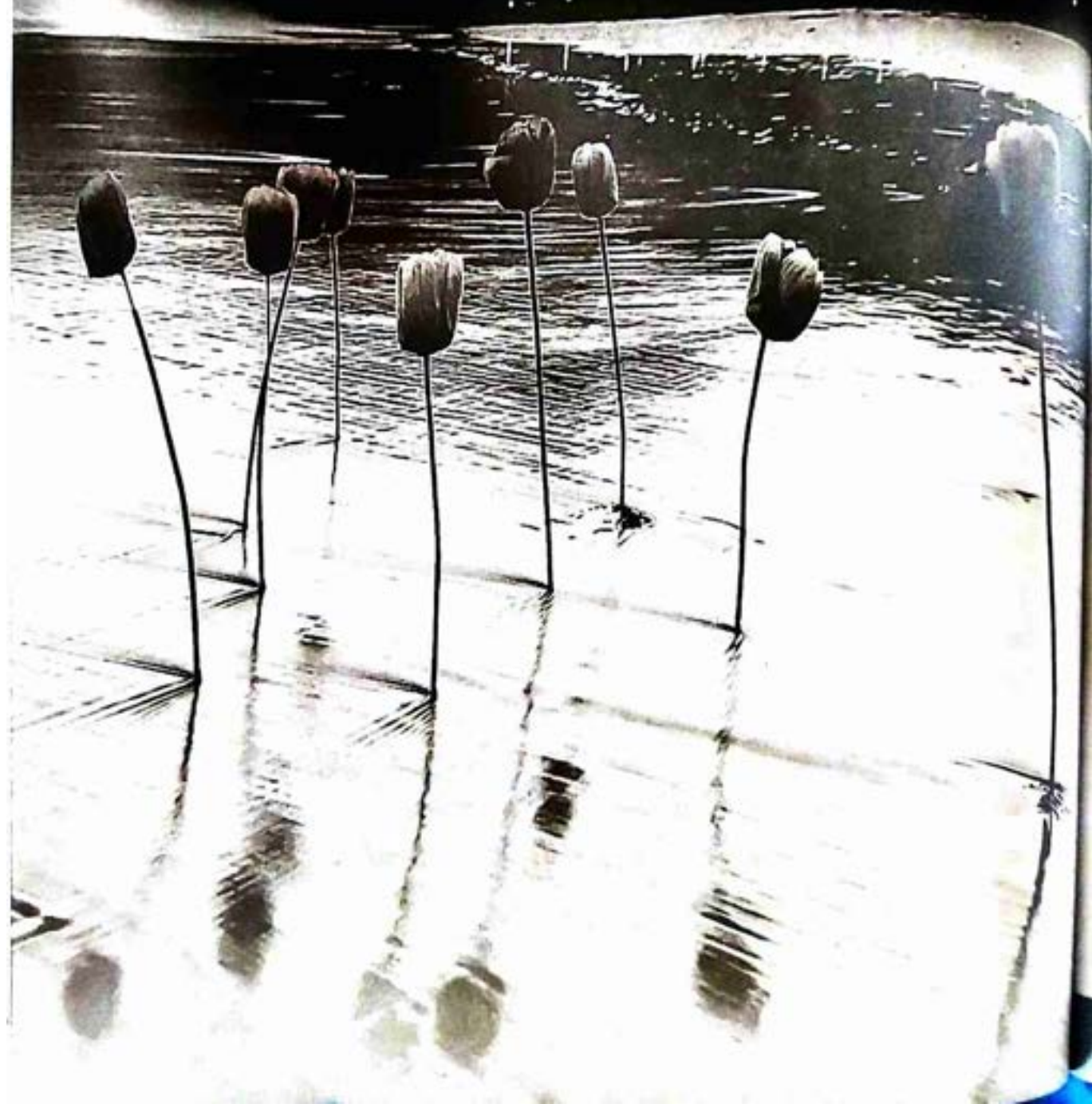
The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has ordered the Central Ground Water Authority (CGWA) to submit on action taken to report regarding unauthorised extraction of groundwater in Noida and Greater Noida. Many Industries are currently drawing water without the consent of CGWA and this has led to the over exploitation and severe depletion of ground water resources in many areas. Earlier in 2015, the NGT had made it mandatory for industries to obtain permission from the CGWA to extract groundwater.

Rejecting the Centre's stand that the implementation of the final award has to be left to the discretion of union Government, the supreme court has directed the centre to setup the cauvery management Board within 6 weeks. This comes as a welcome relief to the state of Tamilnadu, which so far remained dependent on Karnataka's discretion to release its share of water. The Board will also be responsible for working out the distress formula in case of deficiency in rain fall in a particular year to determine the application accordingly.

Bogged by many delays in resolving interstate river water disputes, the centre is now keen on setting up a single tribunal with fixed timelines to redress grievances. A law is expected to be passed in March - April during parliament's post recess budget session. The proposed law will provide for a single tribunal with multiple branches to adjudicate disputes. A maximum time bar of four and half years has been set for the tribunal for pronouncing its award on any given matter.

Major irrigation and drinking water projects worth several crores have been announced to help Rajasthan meet its water demand. Some of the project which will be taken up by the water resources department include the Eastern Rajasthan Canal and recharging of the Jawaldam from Sabamati Basin Project. Interlinking of the banas and Brahmani rivers is also on the card to provide for Jaipur's increasing drinking water demand.

The main reason behind the growth of caste system in India is the assignment of caste based job specialization.

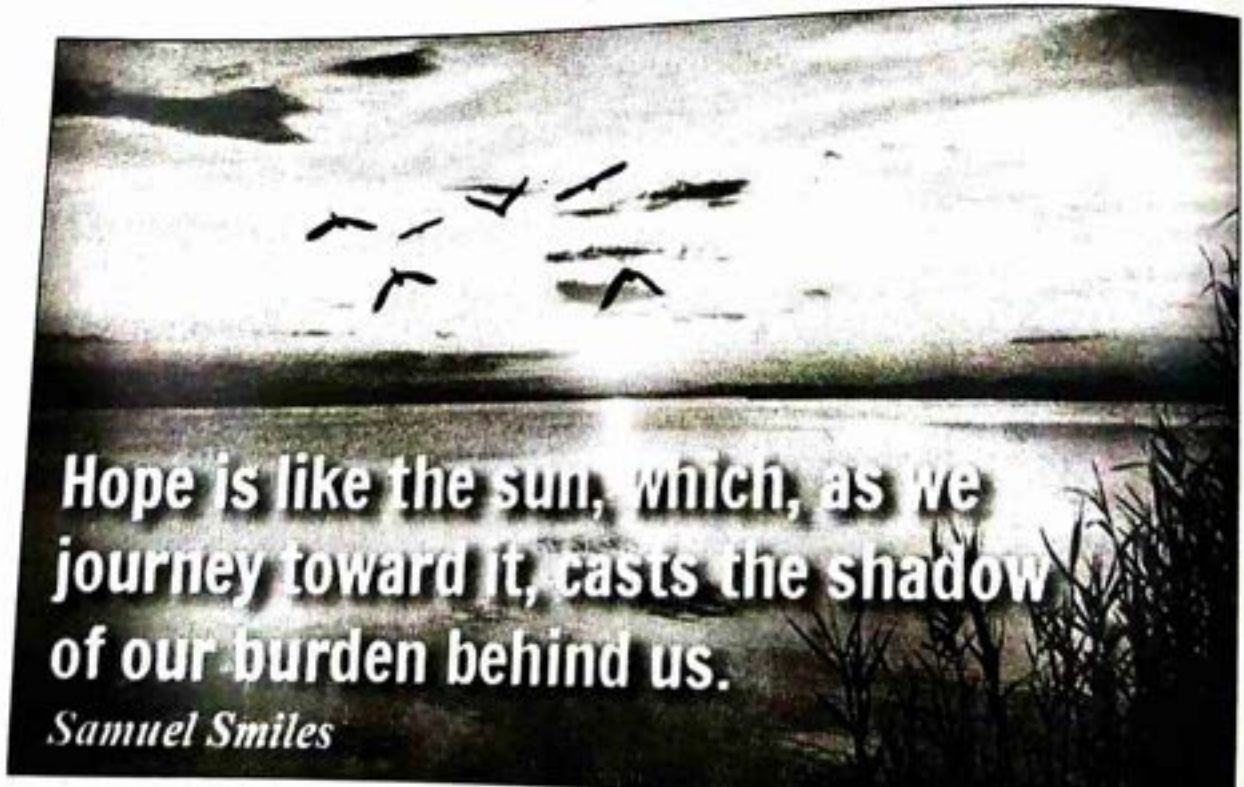
2. POVERTY:
